

<p><b>STEP 1:</b> Pharmacists' Gateway Canada &amp; Document/Credential Evaluation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Enrolment in <a href="#">Pharmacists Gateway Canada</a> (Gateway) is a mandatory first step in the process of becoming a licensed pharmacist in Canada and in New Brunswick. Your profile becomes a document repository where the pharmacy regulatory authorities (PRAs) can access information uploaded by PEBC and candidates' language test report.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Complete PEBC document and credential evaluation</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Apply through your Gateway profile to the New Brunswick College of Pharmacists (<a href="#">NBCP</a>). This step will give permission to NBCP to view your profile, documents, and exam results. <b>Candidates who have passed one part of the Qualifying Examination and met the English or French language proficiency requirement are eligible to apply to the NBCP.</b></li> </ul>
<p><b>Step 2:</b> Register as a Conditional Pharmacist with NBCP</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Create an online profile on the NBCP website (<a href="http://www.nbpharmacists.ca">www.nbpharmacists.ca</a>)</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> *Complete Conditional Pharmacist (International Pharmacist Graduate) application found on your online NBCP profile.</li> </ul> <p><b>Before applying you will need:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Personal professional liability insurance as a Pharmacist (Required: \$2 million per occurrence and \$4 million annual aggregate)</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> A notarized photocopy of your Canadian government photo ID (i.e.: driver's license, passport, permanent resident card) -- upload to your online application and then send original to NBCP office by mail. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> If you do not have a Canadian government photo ID, please provide any government photo ID along with a photocopy of your valid employment visa/permit.</li> </ul> </li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> A Canadian criminal record check through an online company such as <a href="http://www.mybackcheck.com">www.mybackcheck.com</a> or <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> If you procure your criminal record check from your local police station or RCMP branch, you will need to send the original copy of your criminal record check to the NBCP office after uploading it to your online application.</li> </ul> </li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Proof of language proficiency test as per NAPRA language proficiency requirements for Pharmacists (<a href="http://www.napra.ca">www.napra.ca</a>)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Step 3:</b> Internship</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Find a preceptor for your internship (it is your responsibility to find a preceptor in New Brunswick)</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Complete an apprenticeship agreement with your preceptor and receive confirmation of approval from NBCP. (found on your online NBCP profile)</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Complete 8 weeks of internship <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> During these 8 weeks, complete the Pharmacist Apprentice Internship manual.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Your preceptor must complete an evaluation in week 7 to determine if you are ready to move onto the 2 weeks independent assessment or if you require an additional 8 weeks of training before moving onto the 2-week IAEP. If additional weeks are required, those must be completed before the 2-week IAEP.</li> </ul> </li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> *Complete the 2-week independent assessment for entry to practice with an assessor chosen by the NBCP.</li> </ul> <p><b>Before being fully licensed as a pharmacist with NBCP you must have:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> *Successful completion of the NBCP Jurisprudence exam (see website for dates)</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Completed certification in First Aid &amp; CPR level C</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Successful completion of all parts of PEBC qualifying exams (OSCE and MCQ)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Step 4:</b> Licensure as an Active Pharmacist</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> *Login to your online profile and complete the Active Direct Client Care application form.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Processing times can take up to 14 days once your application is complete and paid in full.</li> </ul>
