With a mandate to promote and protect the health and well-being of the public in this province, the College values the participation of, and contributions from, our Lay Representatives on Council who have equal voting privileges as do other members of Council.

Our ideal candidate is preferably bilingual (English & French), has expertise in finance or a legal background and may or may not have previous board member experience.

Eligible applicants are current residents of New Brunswick and have never been a licensed pharmacy professional in the past. Applicants are also subject to Regulation 2.2 [LINK] which outlines circumstances under which a person is disqualified from being a councillor.

The New Brunswick College of Pharmacists is building cultural competency within the organization and believes our mission, *To protect and promote the health and well-being of New Brunswickers by regulating pharmacy practice*, can only truly be achieved if we recognize the unique needs and cultures in the communities where we live and where pharmacy is practiced.

TERM OF OFFICE

A three-year term commencing on the date of appointment and may be re-appointed for one additional term.

TIME COMMITMENT (approximate)

- Regular Council meetings, preparation and consultations (6 8 days per year).
- Committee work, attendance at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and other activities (2-4 days per year)

COUNCIL MEETINGS

- Council normally meets four times throughout the year.
- Some meetings may be in person, virtual or hybrid.
- Council may also meet prior to, and after, the Annual General Meeting.

Councillors are entitled to a per diem and are reimbursed for expenses incurred during activities required to carry out their duties on behalf of the College according to the Expense Reimbursement Policy.
